Project Homeless Connect - East County



Project Homeless Connect brings necessary services to the homeless men, women, and families in our community in one location, on one day. Crisis House hosts the event in East County each year, bringing more than 35 corporations, non-profit groups, congregations, and government agencies to assist 175 homeless people in accessing 1,100 services.

This year the Point-in-Time-Count revealed a 62% increase in the number of individuals who are chronically homeless in San Diego County, and although the 2018 report is not finalized, we do know that the numbers have increased again in East County and County-wide.

- 1. Connect the homeless to services that will allow them to become permanently housed.
- 2. Provide resources and referrals to various health and social services.
- 3. Engage community volunteers.
- 4. Expand awareness of homelessness and the needs of the homeless.
- 5. Work to end chronic homelessness.


and will feature a fashion show by TV Personality Leonard Simpson as well as a silent auction.
