

Domestic Violence Awareness Month



Did you know...

34.9 % of California women and 31.1% of California men experience intimate partner physical violence, intimate partner sexual violence and/or intimate partner stalking in their lifetimes.

1 in 3 women and 1 in 4 men have experienced some form of physical violence by an intimate partner.

On a typical day, local domestic violence hotlines receive approximately 19,159 calls, approximately 13 calls every minute.

October is Domestic Violence Awareness month. Despite these already shocking statistics, the pandemic has made circumstances increasingly difficult for survivors seeking crucial services. Crisis House recognizes this glaring need and strives to provide women and families with a safe path forward.

Our programs at Crisis House are offered at no cost to women fleeing domestic violence in need of housing, counseling, skills to regain their confidence, and an opportunity to better themselves and their families. You, our community supporters and generous donors, make this all possible.

Journey Program Success Story:

"Ann" entered into our Safe Journey program on September 9, 2021. She was a domestic violence survivor experiencing homelessness with her two sons. Our case managers helped her find an apartment and Crisis House provided housing support until she attained self-sufficiency.

Upon exiting the program, Ann and her family now have their very own apartment and have found employment. Along with housing and employment, her family's sense of hope was also restored. Now, her oldest son dreams of working for NASA, and her youngest wants to be an airplane pilot when he is older.

During the festivities, Crisis House was awarded a**Community Service Award** for exceptional community service during the Covid-19 pandemic.



Again, thank you El Cajon Rotary Club, for going above and beyond to help those in need within our community!




